On this Veterans Day, we remember with gratitude the sacrifices made by the men and women who protect our nation.

Today we express our gratitude to the veterans and their families and offer our prayers for them.

We owe our gratitude to those men and women who endured hardships and deprivation for our protection, sometimes paying the highest price.

But we Christians know that peace is something more than the absence of conflict. Christ's peace is "not as the world gives" (Jn 14:27).
